SCE BENEFIT TRAIL TRIAL July 19/20, 2025



LOCATION DETAILS

Goat Meadows Trailhead and Snowplay Area, Hwy 41 and Mount Raymond Road, Fish Camp, CA

This location is part of the Sierra National Forest. We have received a permit to hold our event at this location but that does not guarantee us the whole facility. We will be posting notices, along with the Forest Service, that our event will be held on our date but we can't force others out if they want to try and camp with us. Hopefully after seeing all the horses and vehicles, people will decide to go somewhere quieter.

Temperature: The temperature can vary, so bring multiple layers and be prepared for rain. This event will happen rain or shine. Blankets for horses may be needed especially if you are from

warmer locations. Elevation: 5062

Camping: Everyone is welcome to come in starting on Thursday. Mt. Raymond Road is paved and easily traveled for all rigs. There will be numerous locations for camping, check in with the parking coordinator upon arrival for help. For the extremely large units, you may want to camp on the cement parking pad and pen your horses in the field below. You will need your own pens and there are plenty of trees for high lining. There will be porta potties available for use. Spread your manure in the bushes around your campsite. Camping will be \$20/rig for camping Thursday-Sunday night.

Be prepared for wildlife. Bears are frequently seen in the area. There is a bear proof garbage can available and it is best to dump any trash you have each night so not to entice the bears to our area. The meat bees are frequent guests. Bringing pop up netted tents might make your life more comfortable when kicking back in the morning or afternoon times. If you stick to the trails and obstacles that are set up, you will minimize your exposure to meat bee nests in the ground.





Water: We are having a water truck parked for our riders to get water from. You will need to bring buckets to transport water to your campsite. Victor will be delivering water from his truck but don't strictly depend on this being available when your horse might need it!

Fires: YOU WILL NEED A CAMPFIRE PERMIT! If campfires are allowed, depending on restrictions, you will need to have a permit, even for portable fire pits. We will be working with the local National Forest Ranger for current restrictions as we get closer to our event. Keep smoking to inside of your trailers and dispose of your butts inside your trailers as well. Please do not be the reason another wildfire is started.

Cellular Service: Verizon service is pretty decent in the camping area. AT&T, not so much. You can drive into Fish Camp (2 miles) for service.

Trails: The trails will mostly be single track trail, mild/moderate terrain, some of it fairly rocky. Shoes or boots are suggested for horses. Some trails are used by the local pack station and can be very dusty since they are used so much. You may want to carry face coverings for certain sections. Thursday and Friday riding will only be allowed on the forest roads, no loop trails. We are working on a trail to ride to the store (see Amenities)

Amenities: The Fish Camp General Store is only 2 miles from our location. Pick up ice, sandwiches or some drinks as needed.

Fuel: The closest place for fuel will be Oakhurst which is 16 miles from our location. It will be best if you fuel up in Oakhurst before coming up the hill to Fish Camp. This is also the best location for stocking up on supplies as they have a couple of regular grocery stores.

Dogs: We welcome you to bring your dogs but understand there have been past issues with dogs at our events. Please keep dogs on leashes at all times and do not bring dogs to awards/dining/common areas.

TRAVELING TO GOAT MEADOWS

Depending on when you come to Goat Meadows, you may come in contact with traffic! If you try to come earlier in the day, you will sit in traffic trying to get through the Yosemite gates. With reservations required and the rangers having to look everyone up, backups will occur! Plan your arrival for later afternoon for best travel results.

Southbound Hwy 99: In Madera, take Exit 154, North I Street. Turn left. At second stoplight, turn left on W. Yosemite Ave. This is also State Hwy 145. Travel for about 15 miles. Turn left on Hwy 41. Travel for about 40 miles and turn right on Mt. Raymond Road. Signage will be out prior to Mt. Raymond Road. Follow the road to the campground.

Northbound Hwy 99: In Fresno, take Exit 131 to State Hwy 41. Travel for about 60 miles and turn right on Mt. Raymond Road. Signage will be out prior to Mt. Raymond Road. Follow the road to the campground.

From Sonora/NV Area: Going through the park will not be an option unless you make a reservation and you will have to pay. If you are in the Groveland or surrounding areas, you can pass through without charge. Check your zip code to see if you qualify. (https://www.nps.gov/yose/planyourvisit/zipcode.htm) Apparently they are going to be VERY strict this year on who they let through. Hwy 49 is an option but not suggested as it gets very twisty after Coulterville. Probably best option is to drop down to Hwy 99 and come back up going Southbound Hwy 99 directions.
