IMPORTANT EVENT INFORMATION

The 2013 CSHA Trail Trials State Championship Event will be held at the Marshall Canyon Regional Park (119 acre facility) in La Verne, CA on September 28th and 29th. This two-day single event format will crown the State Champions. At the end of the day Sunday, we will be award Champion and Reserve Champion buckles as well as ribbons and awards thru 10th place. Ride Manager Jennifer Todd and Assistant Ride Manager Janice Escalera along with Senior Judge Rick Wagner have planned a challenging trail in the canyons and hills with obstacles worthy of the Championship. Saturday's ride is approximately 4-5 hours long and Sunday's 3-4 hours.

Camping: We will be camping in the Fred Palmer Equestrian Center. There are 43 permanent corrals. We will also be bringing in additional corrals. The cost per corral is \$50 for the entire time you are there. There will be limited space for your portable corrals at the very back of the campground. If you want to stay over Sunday night for a fresh start Monday morning it is a cost of \$10 per person which is noted on the entry form. Everyone must leave by 11 am Monday. **There are no showers or flush toilets in this facility.**



Water: Water is available throughout the camp area but a hose or several hoses may not reach all camp areas. Bring a hose(s) with "Y" connectors and/or buckets to carry/move water to your horses.

Manure: Manure should be placed in one pile outside of the corral. The parks department (community service hour workers) will clean it up from there after we are gone.

Dogs / Pets: **MUST be on leash at all times** and ARE NOT ALLOWED on the grass area / eating area.

Meals: All meals will be served in the main staging area / grass area between the camping area and the arena. There are plenty of tables for dining. A Hot Breakfast will be served Saturday and Sunday between 7:00-8:30 each morning. Saturday Night meet and greet starts at 6, dinner will be served at around 6:30pm. Dave's Famous BBQ is catering dinner with Texas Beef Brisket, Country Roasted Chicken and all the fixings! After dinner we will be announcing the MVP Awards, special year end awards, and raffle winners. For those who arrive Friday, we will have a Pot Luck at 6:30 pm. Bring your favorite dish along with your beverages/plate/utensils/etc.

Raffle: Each Region and/or Club should bring a raffle prize for the raffle. Bring cash for the Raffle tickets and silent auction. We already have had some very nice items donated to our event.

Photographer: We are planning to have a professional photographer at an obstacle each day as well as in camp for personal photo ops.

Commemorative Wear: Will be available from an outside vendor on a “pre-purchase” basis only. Order form will be emailed to participants.

Fires: Due to the high fire risk and the number of fires in California this year, **NO FIRES WILL BE PERMITTED**. You can cook in your camp area with propane stoves.



Rider Meeting: A rider’s meeting will be held Saturday morning at 8 AM by the stage. First rider will go out at 8:30 am.

Other Stuff: You are choosing your start times and riding partners on your entry forms. We’ll be releasing riders at intervals to hopefully avoid back-ups. Please do not ride in a large group. If you are in a group and there are back-ups, let individuals proceed to the next obstacle in front of you. No Refunds after September 23rd. The event is rain or shine ☺
